Acceptance of Minutes (Geoffrey Canada)

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 a.m. and a motion was called to approve the meeting minutes from October 30, 2019. The motion was unanimously approved.

Superintendent's Update (Dr. Achil Petit)

Dr. Achil Petit reported that enrollment is at 1,135 for Promise Academy I and at 1,036 for Promise Academy II.

Dr. Petit also reported that 20 Promise Academy teachers attended the annual gala for Determined to Educate (DTE). As a partner of HCZ and Promise Academy, DTE invites professionals to visit HCZ staff and scholars for inspirational talks on career and life choices. The teachers were acknowledged at the event for their contributions to education.

HCZ Promise Academy I Elementary School (Dr. Joseph Cordero)

The elementary school's attendance was at 95% for October.

Staff engaged in professional development including workshops in intellectual data analysis, increasing literacy, special education referrals and social-emotional learning. Physical education teachers also attended a professional development event at Adelphi University.

The New York Fire Department spoke to first graders about careers as firefighters during a visit to the school.

Students took a trip to Queens County Farm and learned about quilt-making.

The school gave away 208 turkeys to families of elementary scholars during the annual Thanksgiving turkey distribution.

Dr. Cordero thanked the HCZ development department and Dr. Petit for the opportunity to reward a scholar and his family with tickets to the play "Hamilton."

HCZ Promise Academy I Middle School (Madelaine Schultz)

The middle school's attendance was at 97% for October.

At the beginning of the month, middle school scholars celebrated "Space Week" with science classes led by guests from ERC Engineering company, NASA and U.S. Space and Rocket Center. Sixth-grade scholars launched rocket ships, seventh-grade scholars made lunar rovers and eighth-grade scholars made supersonic parachutes.

In October, scholars celebrated "Kindness Month" by creating anti-bullying artwork and making commitments to perform acts of kindness. These commitments were posted on the wall as part of the school's "Kindness Tree."

During a town hall meeting with Dr. Petit, scholars had the opportunity to ask the superintendent questions about the school and his role at HCZ.

HCZ Promise Academy I High School (Susan Rydz)

The high school's attendance was at 96% for October. Staff members will continue outreach efforts to ensure good attendance.

On October 30th, scholars watched "Harriet" at the Magic Johnson Theater. The film focused on the life of abolitionist Harriet Tubman, who led hundreds of enslaved people to freedom on the Underground Railroad.

In early November, scholars prepared for the student government elections and delivered electoral speeches during their lunch periods. Elections were held on November 4th.

On November 5th, the high school held a team-building activity for staff with games, prizes and music.

Thirty-five scholars with perfect attendance were celebrated and acknowledged with a luncheon.

On November 19th, a painting activity was held for senior scholars.

The school culture theme of the month was "gratitude." Teachers encouraged scholars to think about aspects of the world that they are grateful for.

Financial Report (Jim Hutter)

PAI's enrollment is at 1,135, which is seven students favorable. PAI revenue is on track with its budget. PAI is also on track with expenses at \$6.4M. There is no HCZ contribution through the first four months of FY20.

Student Presentation (Dr. Achil Petit)

Promise Academy students who perform as part of the Forces of Nature dance company had the opportunity to travel to South Africa and perform in a competition at the Soweto theater in Johannesburg. Forces of Nature Artistic Director Abdel Salaam and two of the scholars spoke about the trip and expressed how humbled they were by the experience. The scholars were grateful for the opportunity.
