Acceptance of Minutes (Geoffrey Canada)

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 a.m. and a motion was called to approve the meeting minutes from September 11, 2019. The motion was unanimously approved.

CEO Report (Anne Williams-Isom)

Anne Williams-Isom and Dr. Betina Jean-Louis spoke about the work of Dr. Michael Lindsay - professor and executive director of the McSilver Institute for Poverty Policy and Research at NYU. Dr. Lindsay is a child and adolescent mental health researcher whose work focuses on the impact of mental health in the African American community. He has partnered with Promise Academy and the Institute of Family Health to identify children who may be suffering from depression to support their families with appropriate resources.

Ms. Williams-Isom distributed a booklet about Promise Academy's Cultivating Excellence Initiative to the board, a document that clearly defines the schools' efforts to build on strengths and identify weaknesses to improve practices across the Promise Academy Charter Schools.

Superintendent's Update (Dr. Achil Petit)

Dr. Achil Petit reported that enrollment is at 1,144 for Promise Academy I and at 1,044 for Promise Academy II. Dr. Petit also thanked the principals and the Promise Academy Central Office for their outreach efforts during the enrollment period.

Dr. Petit reported the resignation of Promise Academy I High School principal Zahida Aminy. Education Director Bridget O'Neill will be acting principal until the role is filled. Dr. Petit also thanked the Central Office Director of Operations, Toya Stilley, PAI High School Educational Director of STEM Dr. Chanelle Cox, and the PAI High School Operations Director Monique Misty for their efforts to support the high school during this time of transition.

Deputy of Special Projects Susan Rydz will give the updates for PAI High School.

HCZ Promise Academy I Elementary School (Dr. Joseph Cordero)

The elementary school's attendance was at 95% for September. School leaders continue to meet with parents to discuss the importance of getting their scholars to school every day.

To further efforts regarding social-emotional learning, PAI Elementary has been starting each day with "community circles" in the classrooms. These restorative practices continue to help build a sense of community, emotional awareness and empathy among students.

In honor of a former student who passed away from sickle cell anemia, Promise Academy I recited the Promise Academy Creed together on Sickle Cell Awareness Day.

"Back-to-school" night was held on September 12th with 301 parents attending.

The first parent-teacher conference of the year was held to discuss students' progress with 412 parents attending.

The newly elected board of the Promise Academy I Parents Association (PAPA I) met with principal Dr. Cordero to discuss ways in which they can work with the administrative staff to support the school.

HCZ Promise Academy I Middle School (Madelaine Schultz)

The middle school's attendance was at 97% for September. School staff members will make efforts to ensure high attendance.

Academic Dean Camil Alassan created the "Brothers Initiating Growth and Greatness" program (B.I.G.G.) to ensure that middle school boys are consistently mentored and engaged in community service to help build character.

Middle school girls are volunteering with City Harvest to distribute produce to the residents of the Saint Nicholas community.

Parent-teacher conferences were held on October 17th with 150 parents attending.

HCZ Promise Academy I High School (Susan Rydz)

The high school's attendance was at 96% for September. Staff members will continue outreach efforts to ensure good attendance.

97% of the senior class has met their graduating testing requirements. School leaders are working with the remaining 3% to meet benchmarks.

Parent-teacher conferences were held in October.

High school juniors took the PSAT exam on October 16th. After, students were treated to a trip to the movies.

Seniors went on a college tour to visit SUNY Oswego, Binghamton University and Syracuse University.

On October 10th, the school held a "FAFSA Night" to give parents and seniors an opportunity to complete their FAFSA forms. More than 80% of parents attended and had one-on-one meetings with advisors. The remaining parents and seniors completed their forms in the following week.

To further efforts in social-emotional learning, 9th and 10th graders have completed group projects on social justice, with a focus on self-identity as well as learning how to relate to others in their social groups. Students in the 11th grade have been exploring their passions, their values and their purpose and 12th graders have been exploring their strengths and weaknesses, what it means to have a "growth mindset" and the importance of emotional awareness.

Financial Report (Sara Alvarado)

PAI's enrollment is at 1,144, which is 16 students favorable. PAI revenue is on track with its budget. PAI is \$200,000 favorable with expenses at \$4.8M. There is no HCZ contribution through the first three months of FY20.

Grant Thornton is currently performing the audit of FY18 for PAI. Once the audit is complete, the audited financial statements and report on internal control will be filed with the New York State Education Department by the November 1st deadline.

English Language Learners Preference Resolution (Candice Ashby)

A motion was called to add an English Language Learners (ELL) preference to the kindergarten lottery for Harlem Children's Zone Promise Academy I Charter School. The Board unanimously approved the resolution. A detailed version of the resolution can be found within the October 30, 2019 board packet on the Promise Academy website.

Teacher Presentation (Dr. Achil Petit)

Each teacher from Promise Academy I and II who had the highest percentage of scholars earn proficiency on the New York State exams were honored at the board meeting.

In PAI, fifth-grade math teacher Elleace David had 81% of her students score proficient and seventh-grade teacher Kyler Morris had 95% scholar proficiency. At PAII, fifth-grade math teacher O'Mara Galvez's students earned 75.5% proficiency. 100% percent of the students in Education Director Ryan Carroll's eighth-grade class scored proficient, with those same students passing the Algebra I Regents exam.

The teachers spoke on their methods in the classroom that contribute to student success, including analyzing data closely and teaching their scholars to have a "growth mindset."
